GOD'S WATCHERS

In the ancient world watchmen were extremely important people. They kept communities safe, and were there to alert them to any impending danger or attack. Before locks, alarms, and security systems, watchmen were the protectors, the safety measure. So when the Lord charges Ezekiel as a watchman today, it is a weighty charge. So weighty, we learn, that if Ezekiel fails to sound the alarm for those around him and they perish in a state of wickedness, Ezekiel will be

held responsible! This profound connection between God's will on earth and in heaven is repeated in today's Gospel, where Jesus instructs us that we are to be the security force, the watchers placed on alert that nowhere in the Body of Christ, the church, will there be any two members of the one Body who are not reconciled. Scripture tells us that Jesus reconciled all things in heaven and on earth through the blood of his cross. But we are given the mission to continue that reconciliation on earth as in heaven through our ceaseless efforts to be, as Paul would write, ambassadors of reconciliation. Let us not get too comfortable thinking that we are responsible only for keeping our own lives from the path of wickedness and disagreement. We are also held accountable for the lives of the members of Christ's body around us.

Hurricane Gustav disrupted all of our lives, including many of our plans in the parish.

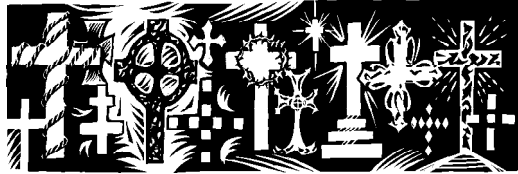
The mission planned for this week has been postponed until further notice. The Bishop's Golf tournament date has changed to Friday, September 19.

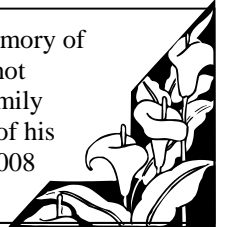

IN THE LIGHT

Bob Weber



Bob Weber recently accepted the challenge to provide five ushers to accompany a lone pallbearer for the funeral of a 92-year old widow that had no family. He felt it a privilege to be able to serve this elderly homebound parishioner as she was laid to rest. This is one of the many types of requests that he can expect as Head Usher of OLQH Church.

Although Bob is an only child, he comes from a very large family. His father was one of 19 children (18 boys and one girl) and his mother, one of 16. He was born in New Orleans in 1943, and in his youth his parents moved in with his blind grandfather so his mother would be able to care for her dad. In 1952 they moved to Lake Charles when his father was employed as a jeweler at Rider's Jewelry Store. His parents were not of the same faith and had been married in a civil ceremony. But the Catholic faith was very important to his mother, so Bob began Landry Memorial in the sixth grade, and in 1961 he was one of 29 graduates from the school operated by the Christian Brothers. When he was 21 years old, Bob served as his father's Best Man when his parents had their marriage blessed in Immaculate Conception Church.

Most baby-boomers will remember that traveling from drive-inn to drive-inn in the sixties to meet friends was the thing to do. Bob met his wife, Larona, at Tom and Mac's. He was a student at McNeese when Larona graduated from LaGrange, and they married that summer in August of 1965. While in college Bob worked at Pelican Cigar Company and Pak-a-Sak convenience stores until he received his B. S. in 1969. Bob began teaching biology and physics at Sulphur High in 1969. He continued at McNeese year round and earned his Masters Degree in 1986. Over the years he became very involved with the students as a sponsor of the Key Club, Chess Club, and Student Council. He had a committee that worked Honor's Night, Homecoming Graduation, and was a senior class sponsor. A few of his many achievements were FTA Teacher of the Year 1970-71 and 1980-81 and Rotary Club Teacher of the Year 2003-04. Bob remained in Sulphur 35 years before retiring in May of 2005. During his tenure, Bob was employed in the summer Governor's Program for Gifted Children. He taught the freshman class of 12 year-olds and worked there for almost twelve years, becoming the afternoon principal.

Bob and Larona have one daughter, Kayla, and a granddaughter, Elizabeth. Kayla was a paralegal for seven years before returning to McNeese to pursue her Bachelor's degree in French Secondary Education. During that time Bob and Larona lovingly helped Elizabeth while she attended OLQH School and was involved in youth activities. She is now a junior at Hathaway High School where Kayla teaches French.

Bob inadvertently became very involved in the men's ACTS Retreat which has rapidly aroused much attention in OLQH parish. He attended the first one, worked the second, and is now a co-director of the third one which will take place soon. He admits, "There was a powerful spiritual change in me the first time, but the Holy Spirit came and filled my soul at the second ACTS Retreat. It proved to be a life-changing experience."

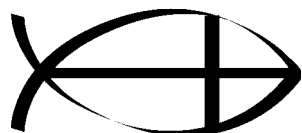

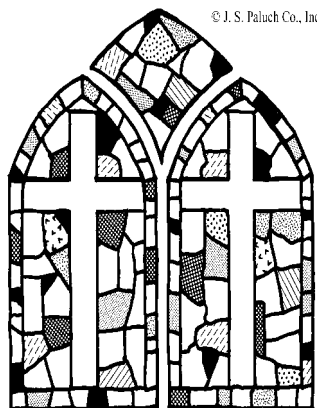
